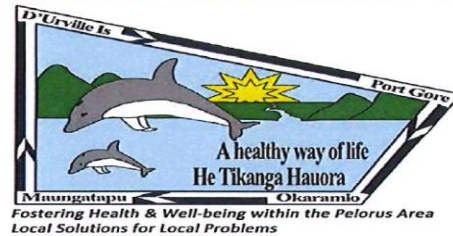

Sign of the Times

The Pelorus Area Health Trust shop has made some changes:

There have been big changes for the charity shop run by PAHT in Havelock. As well as a name change that better reflects what the shop is all about, it has joined the 21st Century and installed an eftpos machine.

What was once known as the Treasure Chest, the much-loved and well-used local shop has become the Havelock Charity Shop. All goods donated to the shop- new and second hand- are sold with the income going to fund The Pelorus Area Health Trust designated community health needs, in the form of charitable grants and physical services. The shop is fully staffed by volunteers ensuring that all monies go to service the community. These volunteers even spend their own time knitting wonderful children's garments donating them for sale in the shop. The low price on all of the goods for sale (clothing for just \$2 or \$3 a piece!) allows all customers to buy things they need at really affordable prices. It really is a charity shop in all senses. The new name reflects this, and is something Havelock locals can be proud of.

The Havelock Charity Shop has also now installed an eftpos machine, something that was too costly to install and run in the past. As Havelock has no atm machine, it made it difficult for people to pay for items with cash. Now the Shop accepts eftpos (no credit cards sorry), it will make purchasing a much easier experience.

Volunteers at the shop have also been proactive in trying to make a change in our own community. In a bid to help rid the world of single-use plastic bags that are polluting our waterways and killing our sea-life, they have been sewing shopping bags out of donated fun and funky materials, and selling them for \$3 each. The hope is locals will use them for all their Havelock shopping needs instead of using plastic bags- the cause of one of our worst environmental problems today. Come into the shop to check them out, and buy a few using eftpos!
